Letter from Reverend Lolla- Summer 2007

Dear Friends in Christ,

Baccalaureate Part II. It has taken over 20 years to reinstate some form of religious service recognizing graduating seniors in the Plum Borough School District. But it will be another year before the Plum Clergy Association can offer the service in the high school auditorium. The delay is not the result of the school district's requirements as much as it because of the late date at which the Clergy Association and the School District worked through the various legal issues that currently exist to understand how the service could be appropriately presented.

The next problem in developing a baccalaureate is to insure that enough students attend so that a new tradition is created for Plum Senior High School. This involves recruiting leaders from the senior class to help in the planning, as well as in the leadership of the service when it is held. The Clergy Association agreed that we would need a longer period of time to work with Plum students to develop interest in the concept, as well as to solicit their thoughts regarding what ought to be accomplished during the service.

A worship service also needs music. Traditionally, high school choirs sang during baccalaureate services. However, the relationship has not been built between the Clergy Association and the senior high school music department. Student participation in worship music needs to be voluntary, and not required for a student's grade. While liturgical music has often been included in the repertoire of the high school choir, developing a culture in which underclass students would provide music from their own free will might require more effort by the Clergy Association.

Third, the Association ran into problems identifying a speaker for this graduation season. Since clergy are discouraged by civil liberties claims from speaking during such events, other speakers are being sought by the Clergy Association who might have public interest. This would take additional time to identify than the three weeks left between now and graduation. Two speakers who had been earlier pursued by the Association were not available for the proposed date of June 4. Identifying an appropriate speaker will take more time.

Finally, using the Plum Senior High School Auditorium as a worship space is foreign to all of the Association's clergy. Identifying sound system technicians, instrumentation for hymn singing, setting up the stage for a worship service required more effort than there was time available to plan.

As a result, the Association is looking forward to holding baccalaureate next year with the expectation that an additional year to develop relationships with school district leaders will allow for a stronger worship experience.

Exploring the Doctrine of the Trinity

Each year it seems, theological debates swirl through the wider church about the nature of God. These are not new debates. They were resolved by the Church during the first 1,000 years of the Church's history. Everything from the divinity of Christ to the nature of the Holy Spirit was scrutinized, argued, codified in the form of confessions, and then formed into a cultural norm. Sometimes these theological arguments were resolved through pitched battles. Other times it took the loss of several generations to end the dispute over theological conflicts. Once such doctrines were generally agreed upon, they became the social foundation for Christian faith, worship, and mission.

In recent years, these old theological debates have been revisited under the pressures of modern life. The covenant agreements that united the Church's theology are being re-questioned today among theologians and some church leaders. One of the most important debates regards the Doctrine of the Trinity. Dr. Lolla will be preaching on the theology that lies behind our belief in a Trinitarian God from July 8 through August 5. Between the two morning worship services, he will be leading a discussion on each Sunday's Scripture passages during the Sunday school hour.

As part of this discussion, we will be examining a document from the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) that has spurred considerable debate within the denomination for teaching about the Doctrine of the Trinity that is regarded as apostate by many throughout the Church. This class is an opportunity for you to become engaged with other Plum Creek members about the depths of your Christian faith. Are you Trinitarian or Unitarian? Are you a Universalist or believe in the unique salvation of Jesus Christ? These and many other questions will be on the table throughout the summer. Come and make this an important part of your summer education experience.

Church Pavilion and Facilities available for Private Parties and Gatherings

Since the pavilion at the back of the church was finished, the session and trustees have tried to encourage church families to use the facility for family gatherings and parties. The church also built the pavilion as a community resource so that other families from outside of Plum Creek's membership could benefit from it. As more families have become aware of the pavilion's availability, various suggestions have emerged about how to encourage its availability. The more use the pavilion receives presents the challenge of maintaining the facilities' beauty. Each family or group that uses the pavilion is responsible for cleaning the pavilion and its surrounding grounds for subsequent use, and for specific church use. Refundable deposits are part of the rental package in order to encourage cleanliness by users.

The pavilion, like the fellowship hall, kitchen, and restrooms in the lower floor of the Christian Education wing, is available for use. Church members receive a favorable rate for the use of these facilities. Use of the social hall, kitchen, and downstairs restrooms of the Christian Education wing is \$25, plus a refundable \$50 Damage Deposit based upon the facility being returned to a clean state and without damage following an event's completion. Use of the pavilion, social hall, kitchen, restrooms, and sand volleyball court is \$25 plus a refundable \$50 Damage Deposit that is returned if the facilities are returned to a clean state and without damage following an event's completion. The church's yellow and white party tent is available for \$50 and can be taken to your home. But it and its 16 stakes, 10 poles, and 12 blocks of wood must be dry and returned to the church in its appropriate travel bags. The church's tables and chairs are not available for rent.

Non-members may use the social hall, kitchen and restrooms of the lower floor of the Christian Education wing for \$150, plus a \$100 Damage Deposit that is refunded when the facilities are found by the Board of Trustees to be clean and without damage following the event's completion. The pavilion, social hall, and restrooms are available for non-members for \$300, plus a \$150 Damage Deposit that is returned when the facilities and grounds are found to be left clean. Use of the church kitchen by non-members is \$75. Use of the sand volleyball court is an additional \$15.

There are several restrictions approved by the church's boards that accompany the rental of church facilities. Use of the facilities assumes that any activity by a member of a user's party that would place an individual at risk; i.e. climbing trees or manmade structures, approaching the creek's edge, entering the creek, careless behavior around any man-made fires, or any other behavior that is regarded as reckless and endangering is the sole responsibility of the user and the user's party, not the Presbyterian Church of Plum Creek. The use of alcohol or illegal substances on the church's property is strictly prohibited. Music or entertainment that might be arranged by a user while using these facilities must conform to standards of decency and moral conduct that appropriately represent the beliefs and values of the Presbyterian Church of Plum Creek. The facilities are available on a first come, first-serve basis on those dates that are available when the church is not using the facility.

A letter from Carol and Jim Brees in Pakistan- April 2007

Dear Friends,

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

The words rang out Sunday as we worshipped and watched the sun rise over the snow-capped Karakoram mountain range. For Carol and me, it was a special time. For the first time in several years we celebrated Easter with our children.

As we remember Jesus' resurrection from the dead I thought the time was right to resurrect my monthly newsletter, fill you in on what God is doing here, and update you on our upcoming home leave.

Easter is a time for celebration and we have much to celebrate. After many years of prayer and waiting, I received not only an invitation to the Sialkot Presbytery meeting, but I was also asked to do continuing education of pastors and elders. The first seminar is an in-depth look at the book of Philemon. We had 15 participants at our first session, where a lively discussion followed a brief presentation.

We celebrate the faithfulness of God in providing staff and leadership for Murree Christian School. After a very stretching first semester, the staff and administration have received a breath of fresh Spirit from three new staff members. One of those is my brother-in-law Jerry Kabell who is the school's new principal.

For the 2007-2008 school year we have watched God take our doubts and fears and turn them into dancing. While there are still some holes, God has provided greatly for replacements for those finishing service or going on home assignment. Now the prayer is for prompt action on their visas and other paperwork.

A letter from Carol and Jim Brees in Pakistan- April 2007-cont'd

At the annual board meeting of the trustees of Murree Christian School, I was affirmed in my decision to step down as chair of the board. This will enable me to return to doing pastoral care for staff and students.

Give thanks for a growing staff of female physicians who now staff the ob-gyn services almost 24 hours a day. Husbands and fathers still object strongly to their wives or daughters taking night call or duty, but they are often the same people who demand that their female relatives be attended by a female physician. One of the measurable benefits that results from this is a significant drop in our C-section rates.

We celebrate Rebecca and Nate coming to the end of their tenth and ninth grade years at Murree Christian School. One of the tasks before us this summer is to visit the colleges and universities that Rebecca has "short-listed" as colleges she would like to visit.

Even as I write this letter I realize that I can't tell you all I would like to. I look forward to being able to share our ministry with you while we are in the United States later this year. We are scheduled to be in there through the summer, and Carol will remain through the fall. We are in the process of finalizing our schedule for June, July, and August. In light of the limited time that the whole family will be together, we are trying to not have to purchase a vehicle or rent any kind of housing. If you would be able to help with either housing—in most cases less than a week and in some cases just one night—or local transport please let us know.

The initial weeks in the United States will be in the Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, area so we can take care of physical exams and attend to issues of health and family business (besides visiting as many of you as possible in the area). We hope to be based in Plum Borough, but have not finalized that yet.

We will make our way to Markleeville, California, to visit my parents and to speak at First Presbyterian Church of Carson City, Nevada, on July 5. Between July 6 and 19 our itinerary takes to the San Francisco Bay area and down the peninsula towards San Jose. On July 19 or 20 we will return to Pennsylvania to be on staff for the New Wilmington Missionary Conference. Immediately following that we have a couple of visits to make in eastern Pennsylvania and then will head to Louisville to take care of more business both personal and church related.

Jim, Rebecca, and Nate will return to Pakistan on August 17 in order for Rebecca and Nate to start school on the 21st.

We have received requests from many of you for a visit. As many as humanly possible will be fit into the time when the family is here together. If not a family visit we hope that we can work out at least a visit from Carol during her remaining time in the USA. If you have not as yet contacted us but would like us to try to make it to see you or your congregation please let us know by email ASAP.

Thanks for all the prayers, support and encouragements.

A letter from Carol and Jim Brees in Pakistan – May 2007

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord.

-Isaiah 55:8

I confess that I have trouble trusting God's ways sometimes. This February I lost my dear friend and colleague Sr. Mussarat Yousaf, the one I have been asking many of you to pray for. She was a woman who truly loved Jesus and saw her work as a midwife as her ministry in serving him. Literally thousands of women have benefited from her work in our labor room. Her memorial service was held in the hospital chapel where every inch of space was full and the crowd extended past the doors onto the ground outside. The gray drizzly weather that day mirrored our feelings. She leaves a grieving husband and a 18-month-old daughter.

I don't understand God's timing here. But continuing in Isaiah 55, I trust that God's Word "will not return empty, but will accomplish what [He] desires and achieve the purpose for which [He] sent it." We mourn our loss, but we do not grieve as those who have no hope, but look for a glorious reunion at the wedding feast of the Lamb.

In less than two months the Brees family will be in the United States for a brief home assignment. We are looking forward to seeing many of you and sharing what God has been doing in our lives. At times it seems to be impossible to squeeze in everything we want to do. Please pray that we will look to the Lord, seek to know His priorities, and recognize what we need to do. Looking at Jesus in the Scriptures, I am always amazed at how certain He was that He was right where God wanted Him. He did not let his disciples, His enemies, or anyone else set His priorities. When His good friend Lazarus died, He did not rush immediately to pay His respects. (In Pakistani culture that is a major faux pas. I imagine the same was true in Israel as well.) However, when he did arrive, something much more powerful took place! "Neither are your ways my ways." That keeps coming up, doesn't it?

So, when can we see you? Below is a sketch of our schedule from June 15 onwards. Much is yet to be confirmed, but it will give you an idea of where to find us.

June 15—Fly to the United States, arriving in Pittsburgh

June 29 or 30—Leave for Markleeville, California to stay with Jim's parents

July 1—Sharing at First Presbyterian Church of Carson City.

July 5 or 6—To the San Francisco Bay Area to staying with Jim's brother in Redwood City.)

July 8—Sharing at Westminster Presbyterian Church in San Jose and Menlo Park Presbyterian Church, Menlo Park.

July 15—Sharing at First Presbyterian Church, Saratoga.

July 18 or 19—Travel to Pennsylvania for the New Wilmington Missionary Conference, where we are on staff.

July 28-30—West Chester Presbyterian Church, Sunday service, and vacation Bible camp programs.

August 1-8—Move family storage from Louisville to Lee's Summit, Missouri. Worship at New Summit Presbyterian Church.

August 9 or 10—Back to Louisville.

August 13-20—Home assignment conference in Louisville.

August 17—Jim, Rebecca, and Nate return to Pakistan for school.

August 20—Carol to Michigan to see family and contacts there.

August 30—Carol to Washington State (still being discussed).

September 10—Carol to southern California

September 30—To Louisville for the kick-off of PC(USA) Mission Challenge 07

October 5—Carol speaking in the Presbytery of Northern New York

October 12-November 1—Carol will be speaking in the Presbyteries of Sacramento, Stockton, and Nevada.

November 2—Carol returns to Louisville for debriefing.

November 5—Carol flies back to Pakistan.

Please uphold us in prayer as we prepare for this time. Much family business needs to be worked in as well. We all have some medical concerns that need to be addressed so that we are fit for another term. We will also be visiting several universities and colleges in light of Rebecca and Nate's entering 11th and 10th grades this fall.

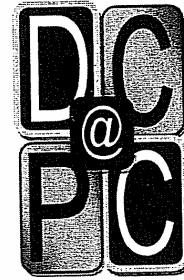
