Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ and Happy New Year!

I hope that everyone has been renewed by the beautiful Christmas season and is ready to start this new year of transition. January is such a unique month in the course of our church year. It is sort of in the in-between time. We are finishing up the celebration of the Incarnation and the Birth of the Lord, but we are not yet quite to the season of Lent, when we begin to look toward the cross and the sacrifice that was made on our behalf.

It is during this in-between time that we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord (January 6), the Baptism of the Lord (January 10), the Presentation of the Lord (February 2), and the Transfiguration of the Lord (February 14). Well, let's be honest. How many of us will really celebrate any of these days in our homes? My husband and I will probably celebrate Epiphany, but only because we have friends who have an Epiphany Party every year. Sadly, these are days of celebration that we, as Presbyterians, do not often recognize, but they are not insignificant events. So, in the hope that these events would not go completely unnoticed this year, I thought that I would give a very brief synopsis of these celebrations.

The Epiphany of the Lord is the day that we commemorate the visitation of the magi to the child Jesus. Particularly, we celebrate the fact that Christ became manifest to the world, and we continue to celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation. This festival is celebrated in many different ways throughout the world. Did you know that Epiphany is the day that begins the Mardi Gras season? It is known as King's Day, and special cakes are made and parades are held in Louisiana.

The Baptism of the Lord is a day that is somewhat self-explanatory: we celebrate the baptism of Jesus! As we know, Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River, and this event kicked off Jesus' adult ministry. A voice from heaven declared: "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." Many people have wondered why Jesus needed to be baptized. After all, he was sinless, and baptism is for the cleansing of our sin. There are a number of reasons why Jesus was baptized, but one reason is that Jesus, from the beginning of his ministry, identified himself with sinners. Of course, this culminated in Jesus dying a sinner's death and paying the penalty for the sins of the world. From the beginning, Jesus was first and foremost *for us*.

The Presentation of the Lord is a Feast Day in many Christian traditions. This day remembers the account in Luke 2:22-40 when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple forty days after his birth so that Mary's ritual purification could be completed and so that the redemption of the firstborn could be performed. While at the Temple, the Holy Family encountered Simeon and Anna, both of whom prophesied that Jesus would redeem Israel. It is one of the most ancient feasts celebrated by the Christian church. (Perhaps we should have a potluck?) It is also known as Candlemas and the Meeting of the Lord.

The Transfiguration of the Lord is the day that we celebrate what happens in Matthew 17:1-9, Mark 9:2-8, and Luke 9:28-36. It is one of the most puzzling and wonderful accounts in the life of Jesus. Jesus is transfigured upon a mountain. He becomes radiant. He speaks with Moses and Elijah, and a voice from heaven calls him "Son." The Transfiguration is one of my favorite stories, mostly because it is so strange and because it's a miracle that happens to Jesus himself. Our Catholic, Anglican, and Orthodox brothers and sisters celebrate this feast day in August.

Although these days do not garner as much attention as Christmas, Good Friday, Easter, and Pentecost, they are nonetheless important days. As we settle into this time that sits in between Christmas and Easter, I hope that we can all take a moment and recognize that there are celebrations going on all around the world. Christians everywhere are remembering these events. In our own small ways, let's join them. Let's give thanks to God for these events in the life of Jesus, without which we would know much less about who he is and what he has done for the life of the world.
